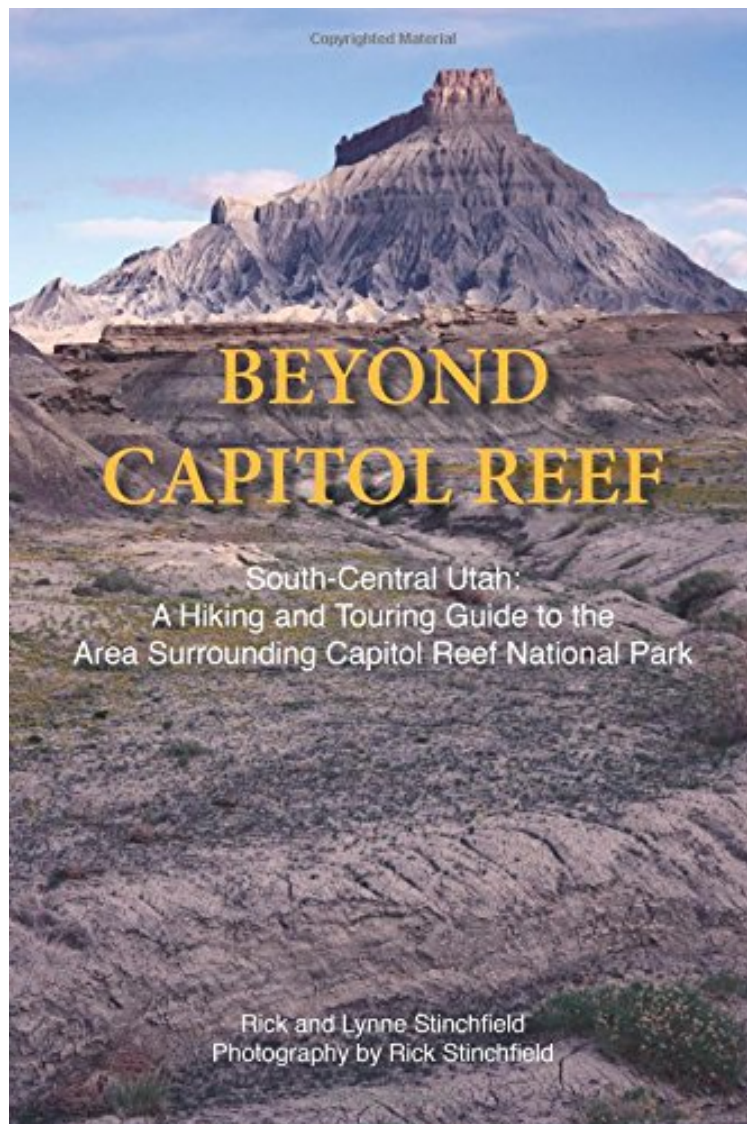

Inside you will find: Short, easy hikes to long, difficult day or overnight treks; scenic drives on paved highways; backcountry drives for standard SUVs up to rugged 4WD vehicles; slot canyons to explore; important rock art sites; and the natural history of the region with an emphasis on geology.

About the AuthorRick and Lynne Stinchfield have volunteered at Capitol reef National Park for three months in each of the last eleven years. During that time they have explored not only the park, but also a considerable portion of the public land that surrounds it.
