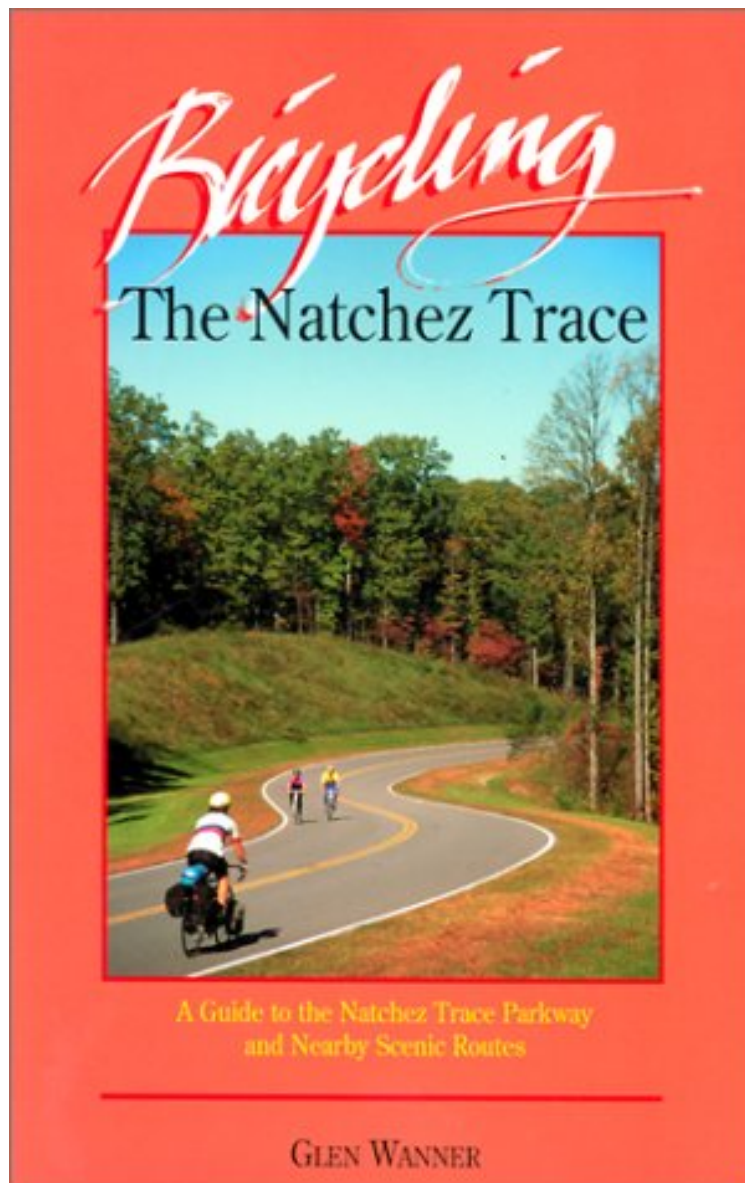

But even then, reversing the order of the trip is not an easy calculation, for those of us who rode it north to south. For those contemplating this ride, it is a great trip. My wife and I are 68 years old and we met a rider or two who were even older. We rode in May and June 2015. The Trace runs from Nashville, Tn. to Natchez, Ms. We started in Louisville, Ky. and ended up in New Orleans, La. and the Trace was the easiest part of the ride. The interaction with traffic along the Trace is the best you can ever hope for and the country you ride through is beautiful and fascinating. We camped most nights but took cheap motels when we needed a shower. I can't vouch for other time periods but if you go in May and June you should expect some rain. Well, a lot of rain. And if you aren't familiar with southern humidity you will get a first class introduction. Hospitality is legendary in the south and you will come home with many memories of "interesting characters" you met on your ride. And get this--my wife and I have bicycled all over the US and some foreign countries. On those rides we have seen a wide variety of roadkill; dogs, cats, squirrels, possums, skunks, rabbits, etc. In Louisiana we saw roadkill alligators! Seriously.
