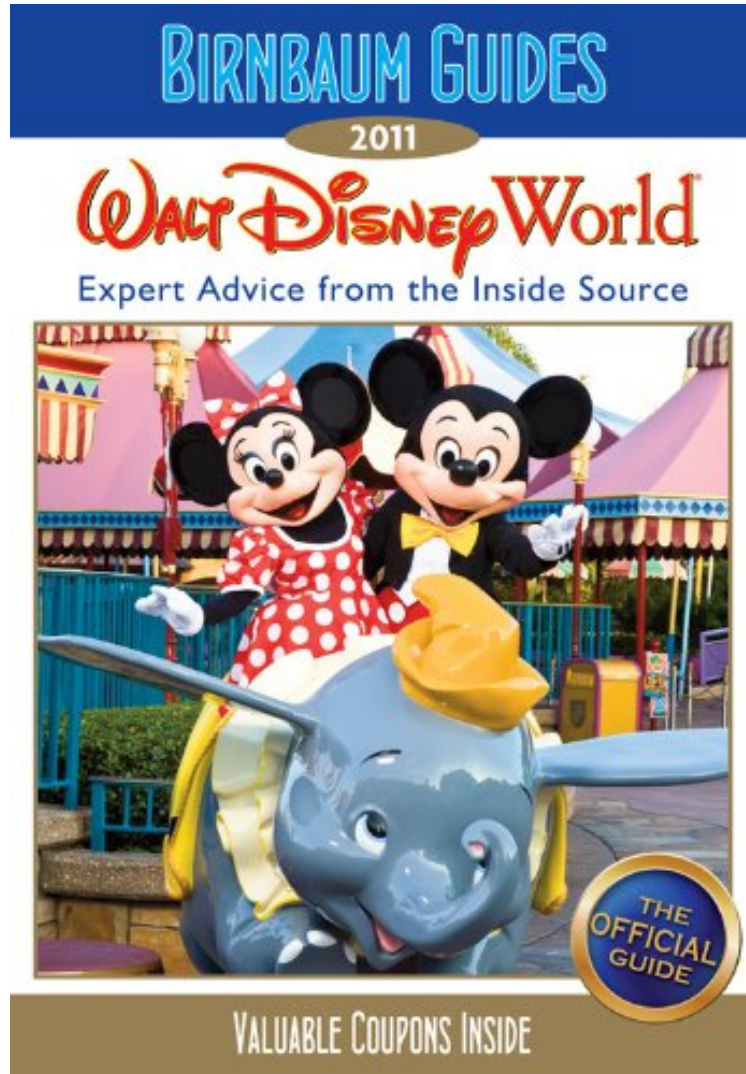

I got the 2011 edition mostly to see the difference between last years and this years. I was gladly surprised to see that this years edition is very updated. Of course a lot of the information is basically the same as the previous edition like the that of "When to go", "How to get there", "Planning ahead", and "Money saving tips", but you can tell that the people at Birnbaum didn't just copy the text on to the 2011 guide. Now, the information about the parks and attractions is very good and up to date, for example, in the Magic Kingdom chapter they talk about the Fantasyland expansion that is in construction where Mickey's Toontown Fair use to be. The guide gives very interesting facts and tips about the parks, hotels and basically everything in the Walt Disney World Resort, useful to first time visitors and for those who have been there before. Keep in mind that this guide is about the Walt Disney World Resort and as it's to be expected the information in it MIGHT SEEM bias but the guide also talks about other options in topics like hotels and transportation, but it DOESN'T GO INTO DETAIL. As a final note, if you have children and want to get them involved in planning your Disney vacation I highly recommend Birnbaum's guide for kids, I bought it as well and my kid loves it, he's been reading it and pointing out stuff to do when we get there.
