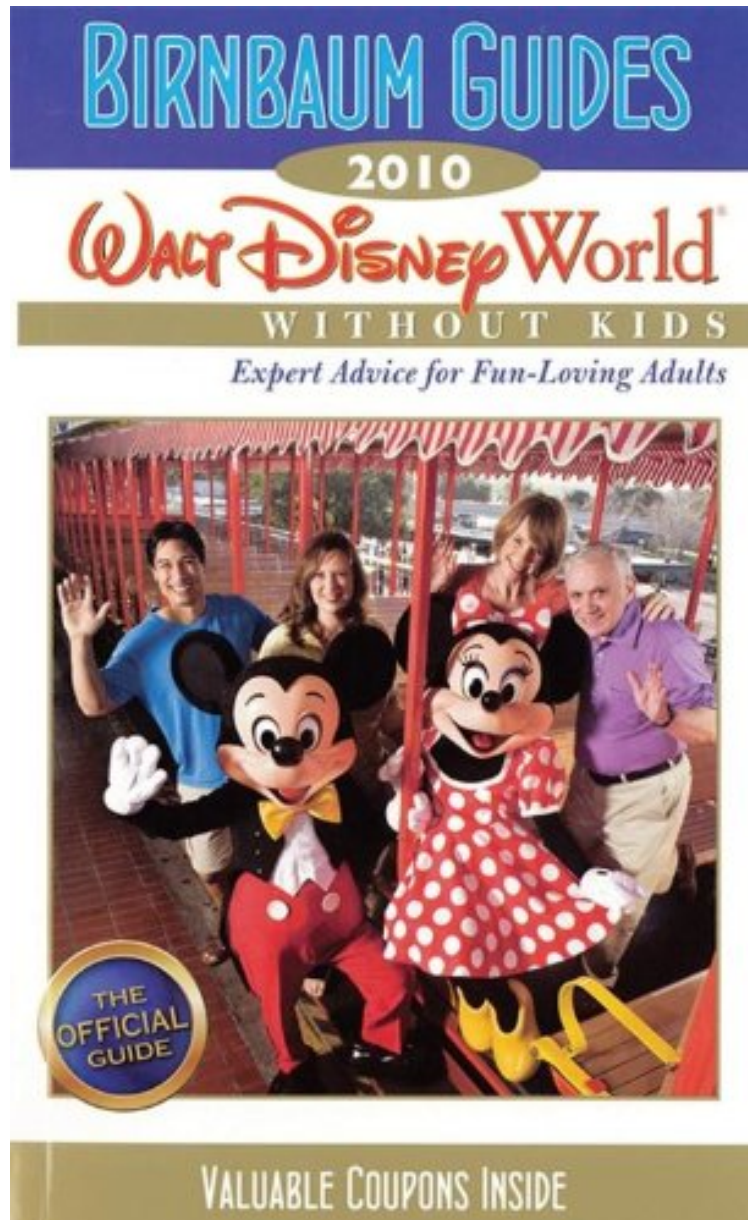

Make dinner reservations. Figure out Fast Pass. Some of the misses that they labeled as hits include: The Hall of Presidents (unless you're REALLY into animatronics from a distance,) Test Track (A big ad for GM cars with about ten seconds of actual fun,) Spaceship Earth (yawn,) The Seas with Nemo and Friends (sit in a moving clam and watch one TV screen after another,) Beauty and the Beast Live on Stage (watch people dance around with pre-recorded dialog reenacting bits from the movie.)
