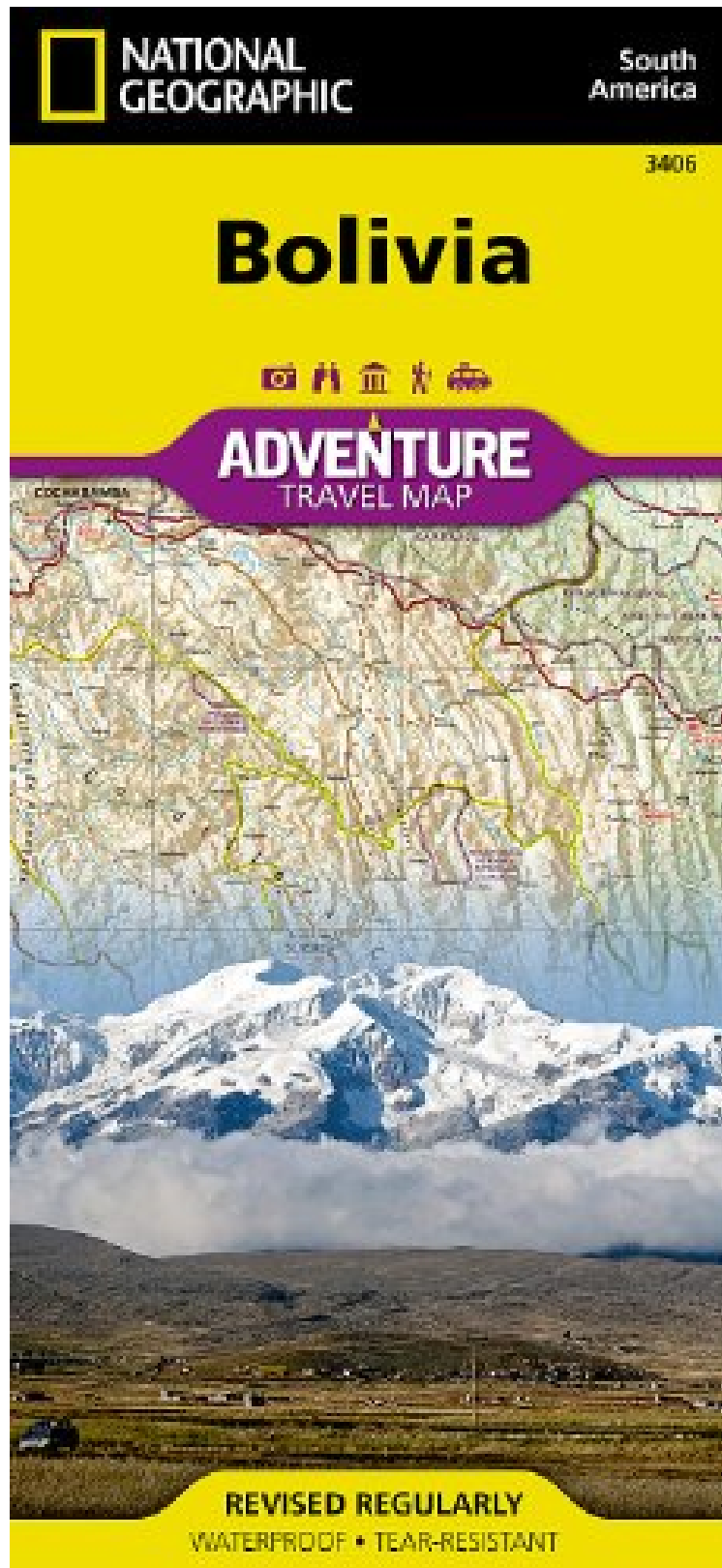

While the map is nice and large, the fact is that it is very much lacking in detail, so that apart from the major cities and the towns in-between it's not very useful. People don't realize that the northern half of Bolivia is basically uncharted jungle, so i think the mapmakers made a mistake including the northern regions, since about half of the map is just jungle i.e not very useful. I will say this, however. The major roads on the map are pretty accurate.
