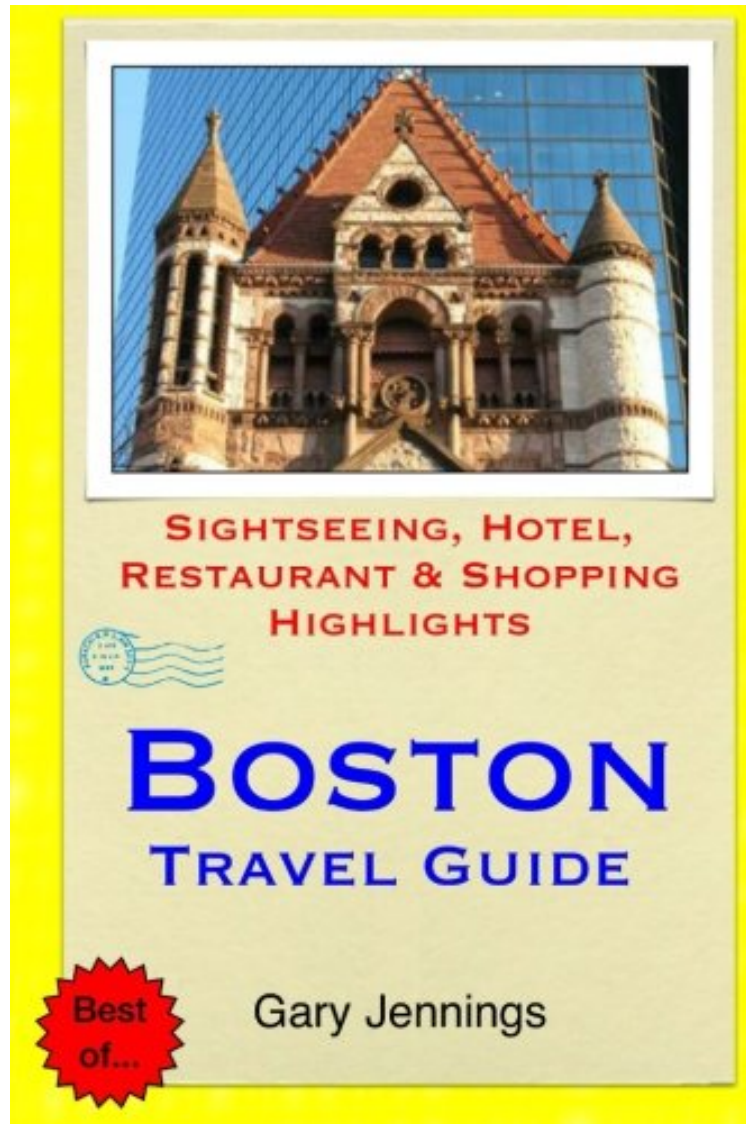


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# Boston Travel Guide: Sightseeing, Hotel, Restaurant Shopping Highlights
