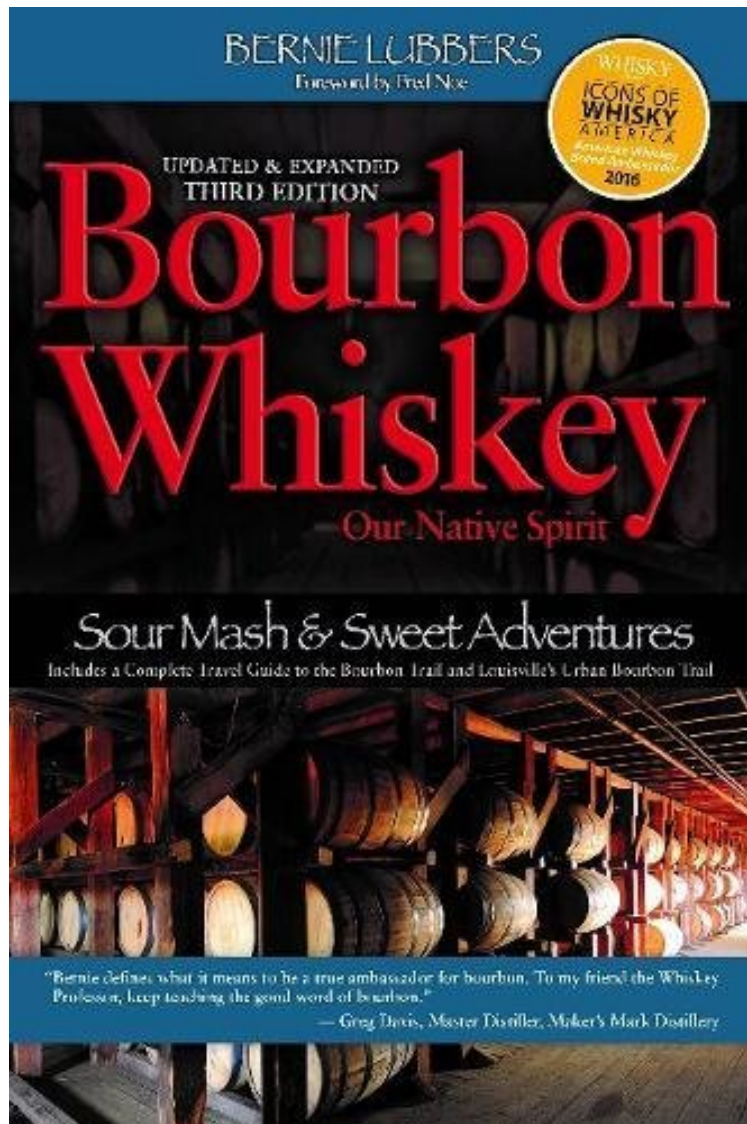

Heaven Hill is the largest American owned bourbon company and holds 25% of the world's aging bourbon. With bluegrass musician Hickory Vaught, he wrote and co-performs a live music show/whiskey tasting called; Bourbon Thru Bluegrass where folks get to sample whiskies from the style of the 1700's, through the 1800s, then the single barrel and small batch bourbons of today.
