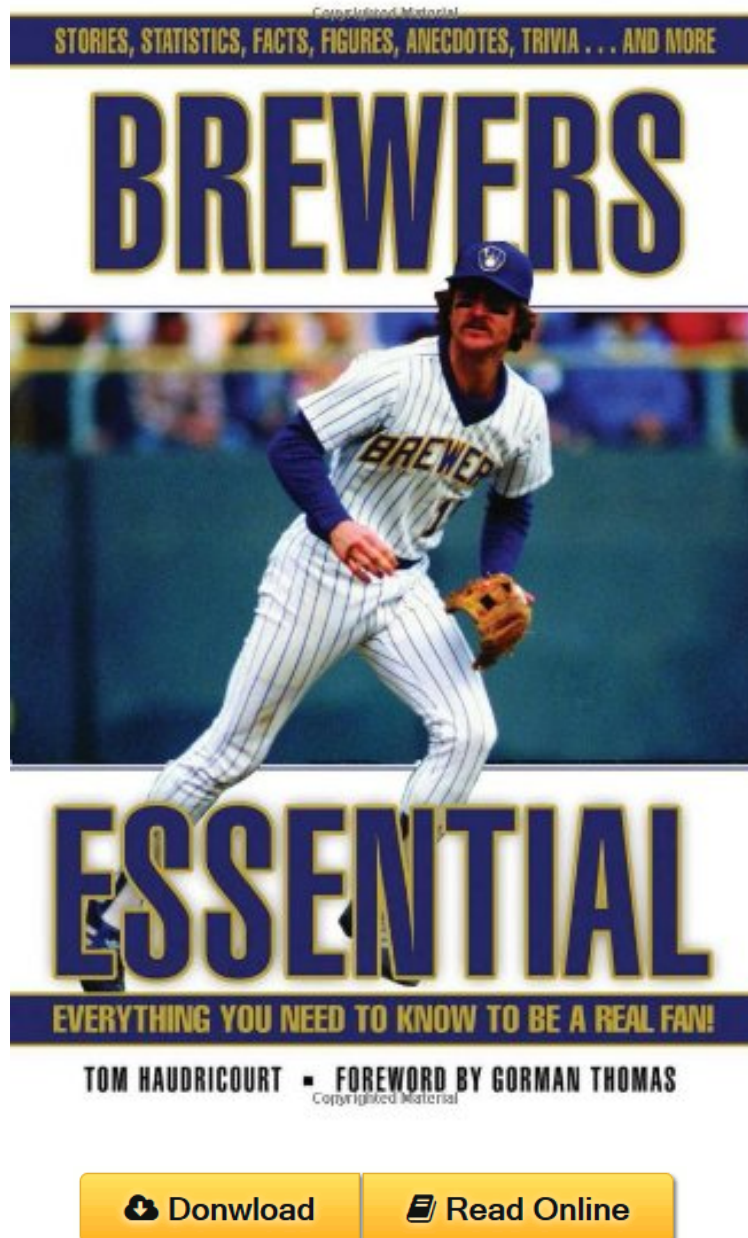

The early days were tough: the team lost its home opener 12-0, wearing uniforms from which the Seattle patches had been ripped off and replaced with Brewers insignias, and went on to post a disappointing 65-97 record. In fact, they would not have a winning season until 1978. But the fans slowly warmed up to the team, and their support turned to downright passion in 1982 when Milwaukee made a championship run.
