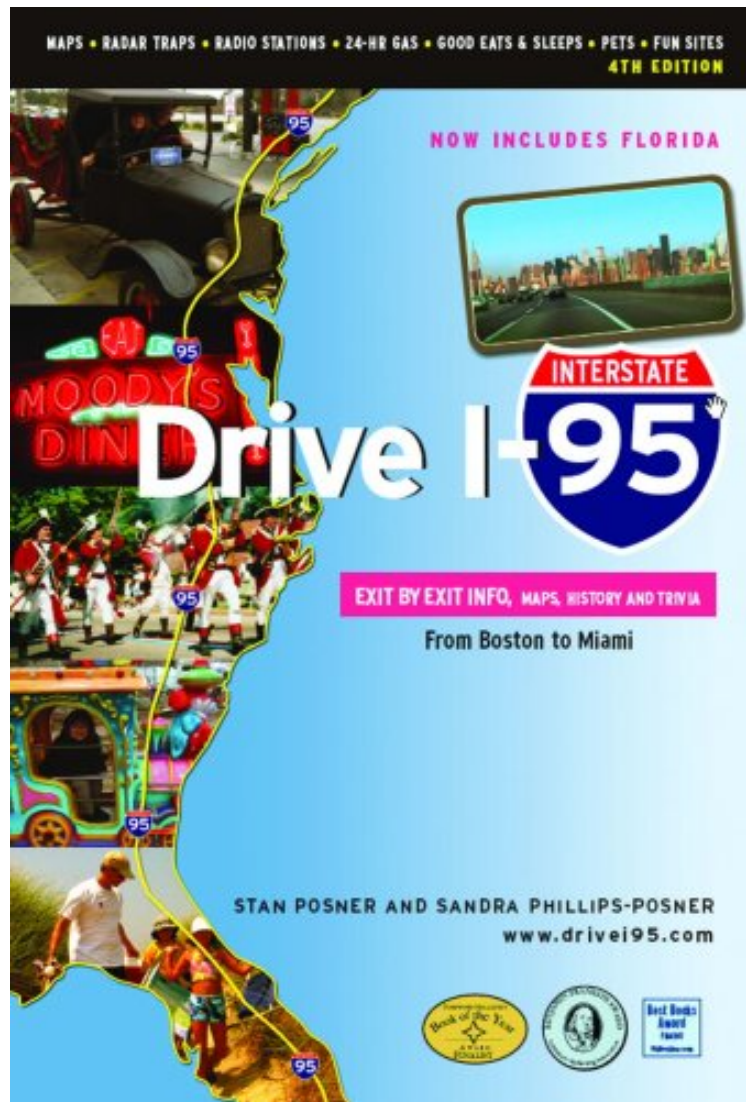

We found it about 8 years ago on a trip to eastern Connecticut and didn't really use it until 2006 when we started travelling from NY to Florida for the winter. The older edition was very useful, listing all the gas stations, overnight accomodations (including chains so if you want to stay at particular chain you can see how

far you have to go) and dining options at every exit from Connecticut to Georgia, stopping at the Florida border. The newer edition continues to Miami and is accordingly significantly more useful. Areas of heavy police activity are shown, the width of the road and speed limits are shown and there is generally plenty of useful information. There is an extensive description of special places such as museums, better inns and restaurants etc. along the way. My book has become a travel journal as I mark down the gas stations I like and the hotels I have stayed at and liked. Now I am waiting for the next edition to come out with some new places to go!!

Road trips are back again, because by traveling in the security of your won car and visiting friendly small town America, it brings back the way America used to be and the way we would like it to be again. To help those who travel up and down the East coast, Drive I-95 is a new style of guidebook. It combines colorful easy-to-follow pictorial maps and fun stories, eliminating the trepidation of a road trip down America s busiest highway. Travelers can look ahead exit-by-exit to see which motels and gas stations are coming up, where the radars trap are or where to stop for a good homemade meal. The drive from Boston to Miami or any section in-between will become more pleasant and less stressful by knowing where to find: 24 hour gas stations (and which ones have a mechanic!) and pharmacies, 800 numbers for motel chains, camp grounds, golf courses, places that allow pets, shopping malls, supermarkets, internet availability and even which radio stations to tune to. This husband and wife team share stories of the road: history that happened on it, quirky museums worth a visit, Americana trivia, homey towns to explore, or places to run with the kids and pets.
