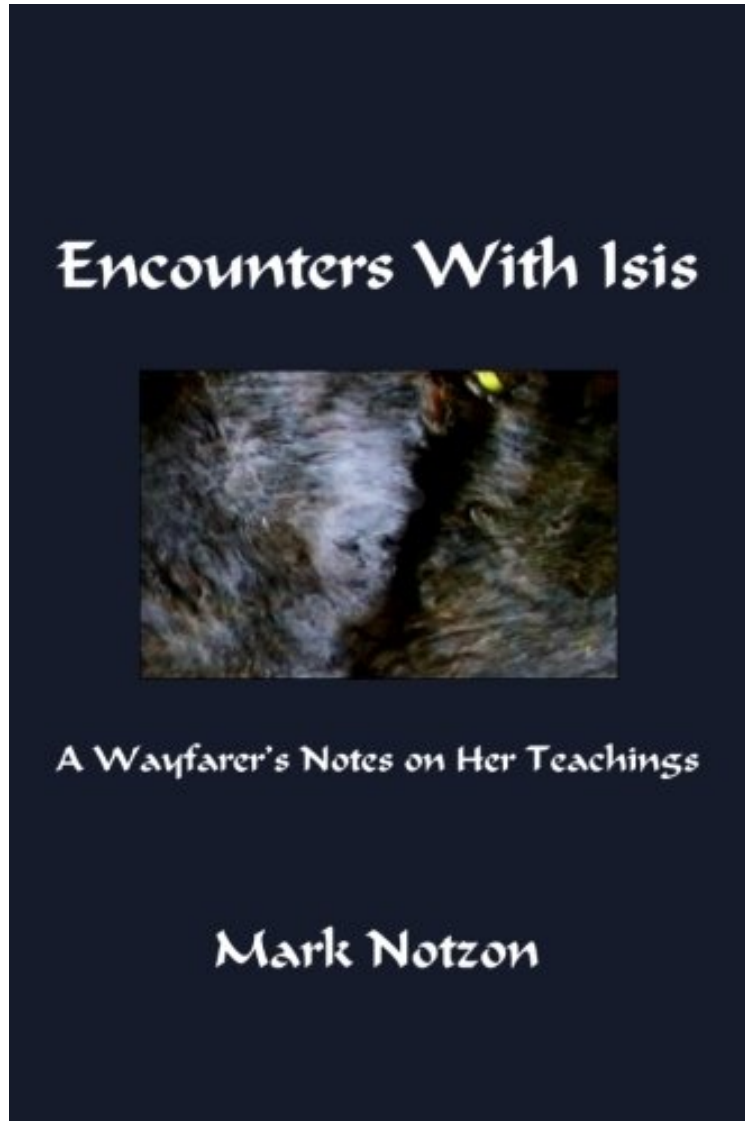

I found it a good read again recently, more than a year after I first read it. The first chapter is a bit long; I can see why the author felt the need to explain where he came from, but I think

he might have done so a bit more succinctly. But the subsequent chapters are increasingly compelling. I was interested to learn about the challenges, and pleasures, of his life in West Africa. The chapters on Indonesia are likewise enlightening, but begin to take on an additional dimension as he finds himself experiencing not only the mundane but the mystical life that is everywhere around him. I shared much in his experiences overseas (although in different countries) and have a different view of spirituality, but his insightful memoir definitely made me think about my approach. His tales opened my eyes and made me examine again my own experiences. This view looks at the departure from typical American Christianity and will definitely make you think twice about your own spiritual growth. It will keep you from thinking your particular path is totally odd or particularly alien from all others. We are unique and similar all in the same breath. It is a good read that will keep you thinking about your own "Encounters with Isis".

Removing himself from what an overdeveloped society has made of language, literature, and a life of the mind, the author finds in Africa Nature stripping away his veils of ignorance, and in Indonesia Spirit shining through the veil of Nature. The Javanese have a proverb: Life is a pause on a journey towards a cup of tea. This book honors the gifts of the pause, however unexpected and alarming -- they may include the visit of a god or goddess (not always to be explained or explained away by recourse to Jungian archetypes) posing a dilemma for the (supposedly) rational intellect. Yet Pandoras box contains more wisdom than the adherents of postmodernism and its offshoots could ever hope to find, even if they could begin to care about or look for it.
