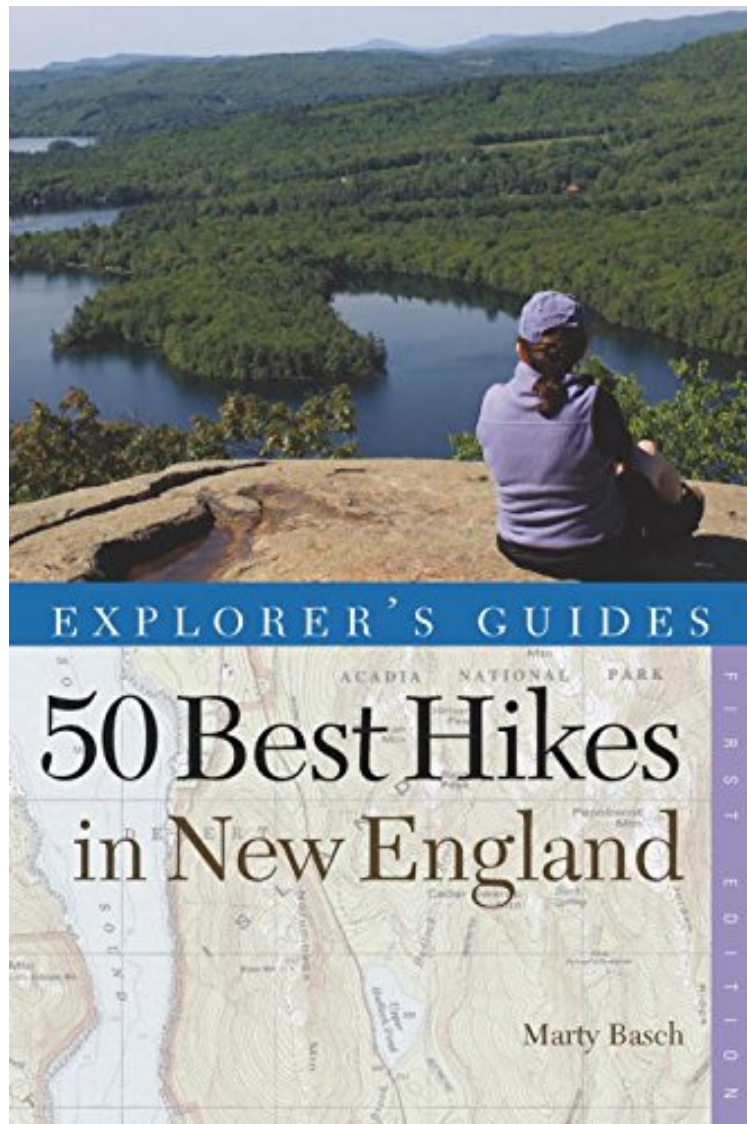

The book includes hikes in every New England state and there is a good summary table at the beginning. Including hikes from every state is a false equivalence. There are 20 hikes in NH and ME, but those two states probably have at least 30 of the best hikes in the region. Given the focus on equivalence for each state, however, how does this book leave Block Island or the Newport Cliff Walk out of the RI section? How does the book leave out CT's iconic trapstone ridges such as the Sleeping Giant?A big plus for me is the author's recognition of the work by New England's trail builders and the crews that maintain these trails. Too often hikers who encounter trail crews are either annoying or patronizing. Even worse, they are oblivious to the craftsmanship that allows them to safely and easily ascend and descend while enjoying scenery.

The one thing I'll say is that it doesn't provide enough coverage for Maine - Maine is such a huge state, yet they devote an equal portion of the book and equal number of hikes for each state in New England, so I felt like it was lacking in that regard.
