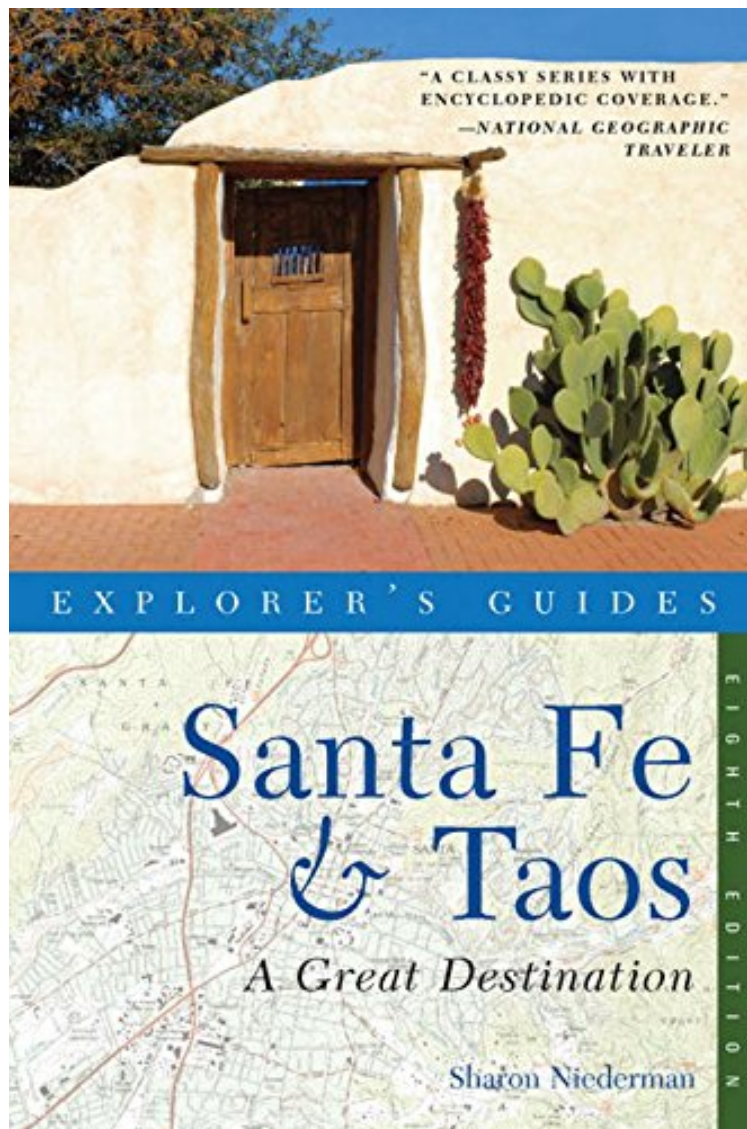

VivesThe book is uneven compared to traditional guide books. It is excellent in its coverage of lodging and dining, with attractive descriptions, what is needed to make a decision. The best part of the book, unlike most guides for which this tends to be very telegraphic and not informative. On the not so good portion is the coverage of sightseeing which is rather short and with very few photographs. Would have liked more detail on the pueblos and the natural sights, what to do there, what to look for. Which is what most guides cover well. Also would have liked more detail on galleries and art. It is obviously written by a local, with deep knowledge of the area, which shows in the lodging and dining sections, but this biases the author towards items that visitors may not care too much about, which shows in the lack of detail on sightseeing and much detail on shopping, supermarkets, liquor stores, banks, etc. I disagree with other reviewers about the warnings of the author, which I welcomed. This is not a propaganda guide, as those put out by the local tourist offices, but an honest review of the area. I appreciated the honesty. Like other reviewers I would also liked to have a guide like those that DK puts out (San Francisco, New York, London, Paris, etc.), but this is a small town, with relatively low demand that cannot justify the investment. Information on one location is scattered all over the book. We just prefer the type of guide book that is organized geographically-- easier when you are on the road and trying to decide where to go next or when you pull into an area spontaneously. Sharon Niederman's guide is the exact opposite. There are very few maps and those that there are are vague, lacking in detail and accuracy. The photos do nothing to assist the reader - poor quality and grainy. The worst aspect of the book is the manner in which it is organized. To get an overview of any site or feature, the reader has to flip back and forth from section to section, trying to use the inadequate index as a guide. Its an exercise in frustration with very little valuable information provided. Santa Fe, Taos and the surrounding areas deserve a much better guide. Eyewitness please take note.
