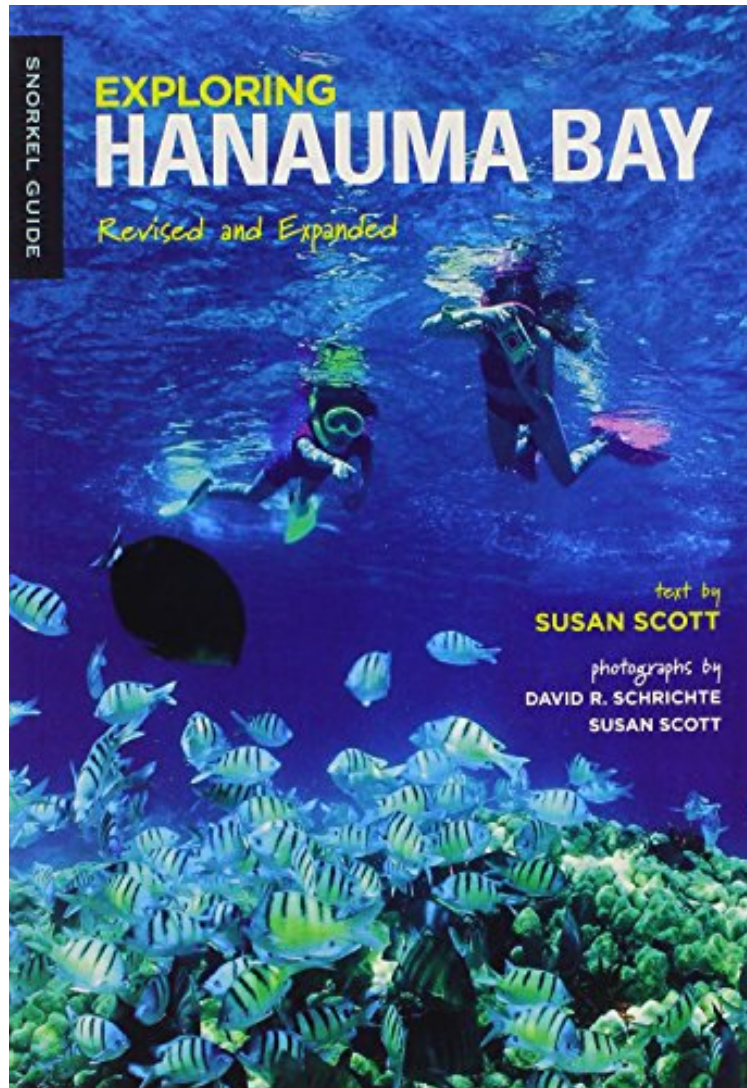

Each tour shows exactly where to go and what you might see. So much of the underwater wildlife can be seen in many places in the bay, so it's good to look at all the tours for the critters you might encounter. The pictures are beautiful and really help you identify the fish and other animals you see. This version is updated to reflect the areas now closed to the public for safety reasons, like The Toilet Bowl and the ledges on either side of the bay. The book is also the perfect size to slip into your pack to take with you to the bay.
