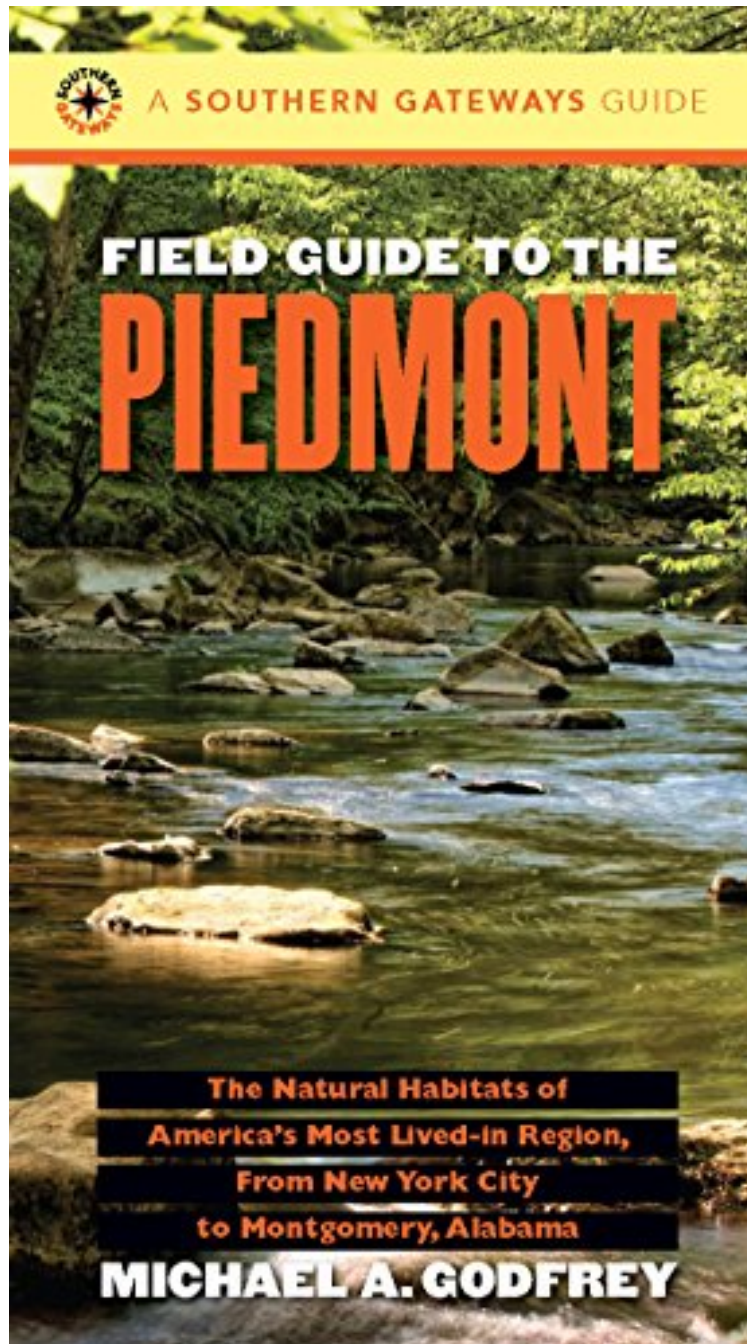

This is a good book and it covers more detail about more subjects than I anticipated.I find it highly interesting to read about the history of the Piedmont since I work in the field investigating forested communities that have been heavily impacted over time through development and have experienced different periods of succession.It is not an exciting or fast-paced read. I've been working on reading it for several months and find it interesting but I'm not plowing through it. I feel like this should have been recommended reading somewhere during my education in natural resources, especially living in the Piedmont, going to school there, and anticipating a career there.As a working professional, I know we don't have a lot of free time but this is something I wish I had already read so I'm making time for it.
