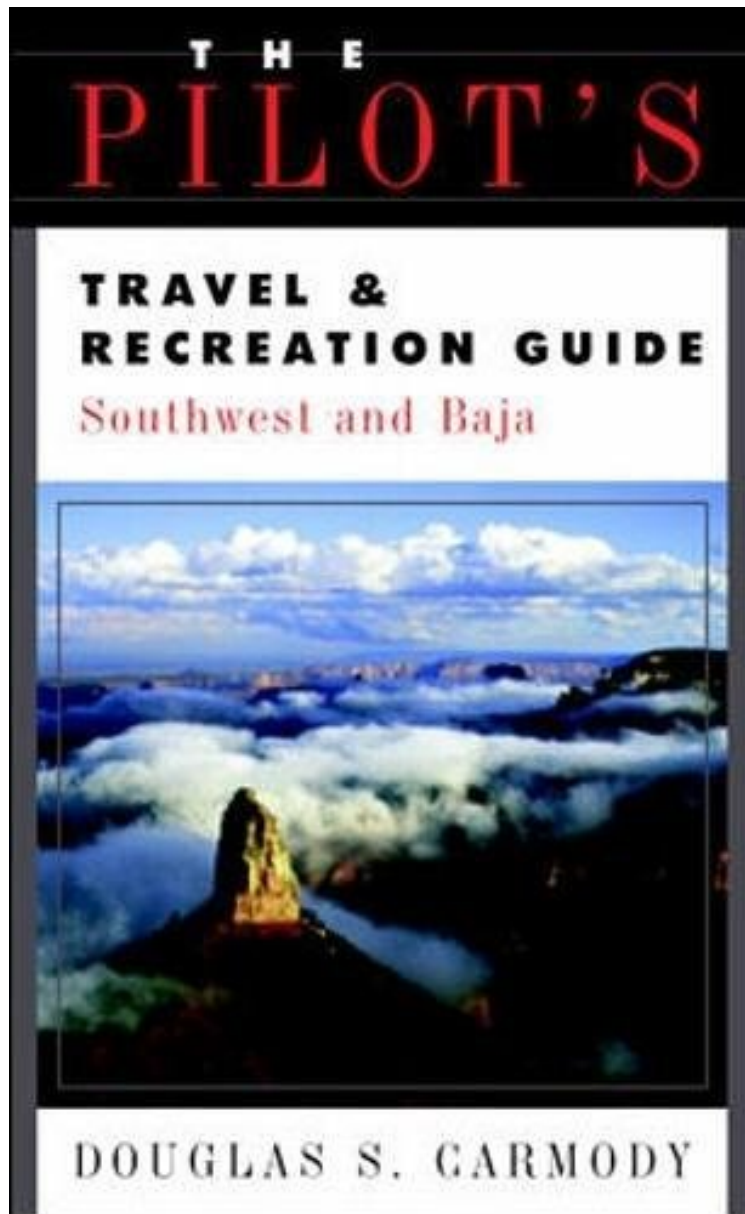

Second, the information on Southwestern airports is sketchy and incomplete.
